

Check boxes can be completed on paper and will show the same in the Smart List.

[] Could try to see if the chatbots can parse events from an uploaded RB calendar page the way they would a screenshot.

[] Tabs could be used on the RB pages for today, the start of the week, or other shortcuts, e.g. on Amazon.

Dividers can be purchased for the different sized notebooks that slide into the coil, e.g. on Etsy.

Sticky Notes may act as dividers in the meantime.

The Rocketbook sample pages can be printed upon to get the QR code into a user page format so they can scan it with the app.

So they can convert their planner into a Rocketbook.

Those could be used to fine-tune a chatbot to automatically process the pages afterward.

Or just cut out the QR code and stick that

on any other pages for scanning.

-- Did anyone release a full Rocketbook PDF?

For example, if they wrote documentation or lab notes and then just uploaded for distribution.

Or published pages as blogs.

Made a fiction narrator.

The style is novel.

They might have rewritten the page as another draft after upload though. More than once.

Dedicated each book to a genre.

-- Question for chatbot: If you were to design a Rocketbook, what kinds of pages would you offer?

Notes go through chatbots for feedback. Those can recommend Tweets on X. That algorithm then matches a feed.

* A goal is to quantify activities. Keep

counts & statistics to visualize.
